Scholarship Instructions

The NAACP Scholarship Fund is established to assist and encourage young students who are about to enter an institution of higher learning. Students must reside and attend school in Genesee County.

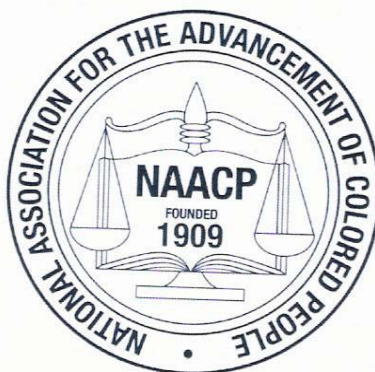
To be eligible to apply, the student must be a U.S. citizen and a graduating senior of an accredited high school. His or her academic record will be one of the selection criteria. Membership in the NAACP is desirable, but not a requirement.

The student will be asked to complete the online application, a brief essay, evidence of community service and the special qualities or experiences that have shaped his/her life. Three (3) references should accompany the application.

Applications must be Typed
(completed online, printed, and postmarked by January 26, 2019)
Please NOTE: Handwritten Applications will not be accepted

Candidates will be notified by mail and asked to appear before an interview panel on **February 19, 2019**. Before one can receive the nomination, he or she must have proof of being accepted by an accredited college, university or technical school.

Individuals receiving an award will be notified by mail **on or before February 22, 2019**. **The awardees will be asked to attend or have their parent/guardian attend the NAACP Freedom Fund Dinner on March 9, 2019**. The “pledge” for the award will be presented at the dinner. **Please NOTE:** (1). The actual monetary grant will be made after the satisfactory completion of the awardees first semester. (2). The amount of the grant may vary in accordance with the funds and sources available.

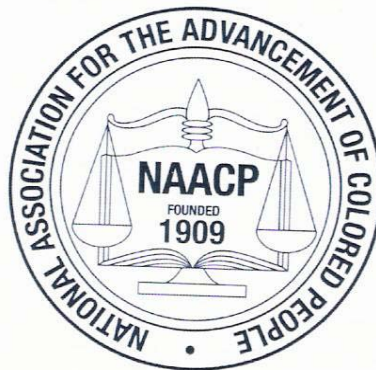
